

LOSSA WRESTLING PLAYING REGULATIONS 2025 - 2026

Classification: Boys / Girls / Open

Competition Format: The weight divisions to be listed are:

17 Open Boys Weight Classes (KG): 38, 41, 44, 47.5, 51, 54, 57.5, 61, 64, 67.5, 72, 77, 83, 89, 95, 130, over 130

- In order to compete in the 130 kg class, a competitor must weigh in over 95 kg and in order to compete in the highest weight class, a competitor must weigh in over 130 kg.

17 Open Girls Weight Classes (KG): 38, 41, 44, 47.5, 51, 54, 57.5, 61, 64, 67.5, 72, 77, 83, 89, 95, 115, over 115

- In order to compete in the 115 kg class, a competitor must weigh in over 95 kg and in order to compete in the highest weight class, a competitor must weigh in over 115 kg.

PRACTICE REQUIREMENTS

Any wrestler participating in an OFSAA Championship or OFSAA qualifying event, must have participated as a member of a bona fide high school program during the current school wrestling season in a minimum of twenty (20) practices at a location where the majority of his/her high school practices are held under the supervision of a teacher-coach as certified by the school principal.

OTHER WRESTLING INFORMATION

- 1. Wrestlers in all weight classes must be seeded by the convenor using the criteria listed below. After seeded wrestlers, random numbers will be assigned at weigh-in by the official for the purpose of completing the rest of the draw.
- 2. All entrants to LOSSA must be submitted on the form provided by the convenor no later than 1 week prior to the official weigh in.
- 3. Failure to submit a wrestler's name, incomplete or inaccurate information will result in the immediate disqualification of the wrestler.
- 4. Competition in weight classes that require round robin format must be structured so that the number 1 and number 2 seeds are in the last round of the round robin competition.
- 5. Team points will be awarded as follows:

Boys – Count best 12 point recording wrestlers Girls – Count best 10 point recording wrestlers

Weight Classes (8+ wrestlers) $1^{st} - 13$ pts, $2^{nd} - 10$ pts, $3^{rd} - 8$ pts, $4^{th} - 6$ pts, $5^{th} - 4$ pts, $6^{th} - 2$ pts Weight Classes (5-8 wrestlers) $1^{st} - 10$ pts, $2^{nd} - 8$ pts, $3^{rd} - 6$ pts, $4^{th} - 4$ pts, $5^{th} - 2$ pts, $6^{th} - 1$ pt Weight Classes (4 wrestlers) $1^{st} - 8$ pts, $2^{nd} - 6$ pts, $3^{rd} - 4$ pts, $4^{th} - 2$ pts Weight Classes (3 wrestlers) $1^{st} - 8$ pts, $2^{nd} - 6$ pts, $3^{rd} - 4$ pts Weight Classes (≤ 2 wrestlers) $1^{st} - 6$ pts, $2^{nd} - 4$ pts

- 6. Protests must be written and handed to the convenor within fifteen minutes of the conclusion of the match in question.
- 7. LOSSA Champion and the winner of the silver medal <u>or</u> if eligible the winner of the bronze/silver challenge match will advance to OFSAA.
- 8. LOSSA wrestling will have the official weigh-in in the day(s) before the LOSSA tournament. The weigh-ins will be held at sites designated by the convenor. These sites will take into consideration schools in the north/south and east/west.
- 9. In conjunction with the regular LOSSA tournament schedule a LOSSA WRESTLING LEAGUE schedule will be implemented. The LOSSA convenor will make arrangements with the Durham Region Officials Association to schedule referees for the League Schedule. The LOSSA League competition / match pairing assignments will be organized by the convenor & coaches involved with hosting the league event.
- 10. Fees for the season will be determined prior to the LOSSA Championships based on the number of wrestlers and expenses throughout the season
- 11. LOSSA Championships you must "participate either by competing or by winning by default/forfeit" in at least 2 LOSSA officiated events to be eligible for the LOSSA Championships. (This would include any 2 LOSSA meets or tournaments hosted by a school in LOSSA)

SEEDING CRITERIA:

It is the responsibility of coaches to share accurate seeding information with the LOSSA convenor. At weigh-ins, ALL wrestlers will be assigned a random number by the weigh-in official.

- 1. Returning LOSSA Champion in that weight class. If there is not a returning champion, but there are champions from other weight classes, the champion from the heavier weight class takes precedence.
- 2. OFSAA placing from the previous year in the weight class, counting 1 through 6 only. If there are no top 6 finishers from that weight class, the wrestler from the heavier weight class will be seeded higher.
- 3. Returning LOSSA medallist in that weight class. If there is not a returning medallist, but there are medallists from other weight classes, the medallist from the heavier weight class takes precedence.
- 4. Nationals placing from the previous year.
- 5. Provincials placing from the previous year.
- 6. All remaining wrestlers will be seeded based on the random number assigned at weigh-in by the official as outlined above.
